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### What is sociolinguistics?

- Sociolinguistics is a subfield of linguistics that
  - studies how social stratification reflects in language variation
  - and critically addresses language-related social inequalities.
- In the Hungarian context, stigmatization of dialect speakers is well-documented (Kontra 2018, Jánk 2023).
- Participatory approaches have emerged in the field (Bodó et al. 2022), including citizen science ones, aiming to tackle such issues for change.

## **PROBLEM**


Citizens and scholars are taking steps to promote dialects – independently from each other.

We created a database and a map with the intention of uniting these two different types of endeavors.


#### Rymes' approach to CS


- Citizens do metalinguistic theorization actively online – that deserves to be acknowledged and studied (Rymes 2020, Bridges 2021).
- Criticism: this way citizens are left out of academic knowledge production.





#### Our map

- participation in summer camps and workshops for teacher trainees












## SOLUTION


A combination of experimental and CS study w/ high school students (speakers of *Palóc* dialect).

- Defined as "the engagement of non-professionals in doing sociolinguistic research" (Svendsen 2018: 137).
- Especially fruitful w/ pupils (Svendsen & Goodchild 2024, Laihonen et al. ms.).

Students as citizen scientists invited to conduct interviews with the elderly






